*Abstract of the Will of Andrew Pearce of the Parish of Camborne in the County of Cornwall, written 6 Aug 1803, proved 13 May 1807.*

Gives £1 1s. to **Margaret Pearce his daughter-in-law.**

Gives £1 1s. to **his granddaughter Ann Teague wife of John Teague.**

Gives 10s. 6d. each to the said **John Teague** and his children.

Gives £1 1s. to **his grand-daughter Elizabeth Pearce the wife of Richard Pearce.**

Gives 10s. 6d. each to the said **Richard Pearce** and his two children.

Gives 10s. 6d. to **his grandchildren Mary, Grace, William, Andrew and Richard, children of his son William Pearce.**

Gives £1 1s. to **his son Richard Pearce**, along with the house and garden now rented by James Sowden.

Gives to **his son John Pearce** his lands and tenements, goods and chattels, appointing him sole executor of his last will and testament.

Andrew Pearce married Mary King on 11 Jul 1747 in Gwinear, Cornwall.

Andrew and Mary had five children:

- Andrew, christened 13 May 1749 in Gwinear. Andrew married Margaret Rogers on 1 Oct 1780 in Camborne. Andrew Pearce, Jnr. predeceased his father, buried in Camborne on 11 Jan 1789. Administration was granted to widow **Margaret** 22 May 1789 (Reference: AP/P/3877 A).
- **William**, christened 26 Sep 1751 in Gwinear.
- **John**, christened 2 Feb 1754 in Gwinear.
- **Richard**, christened 12 Jul 1756 in Camborne.
- Anne, christened 11 Dec 1757 in Camborne.

Mary wife of Andrew Pearce was buried in Camborne on 3 Jan 1800. Andrew was buried in Camborne 17 Apr 1807.
