Abstract of the Will of Ann Owen of Crafnant in the Parish of Llanfair-juxta-Harlech in the County of Merioneth, Widow, written 23 Apr 1746, codicil written 19 Aug 1746, proved 1748.

Gives and bequeaths 20 shillings to her son William Rhydderch.

Gives and bequeaths £5 to her daughter Margaret Rhydderch for her own separate use. Gives and bequeaths to her son-in-law, Margaret's husband, Ellis Isaac, all sums of money he owes to her.

Gives and bequeaths £10 to her grandson Griffith Williams, son of Gwilim Williams and her daughter Jane Owen.

Gives and bequeaths £2 each to her grandchildren John, Owen, Margaret & Robert Jones, children of Robert Jones and her said daughter Jane Owen.

Gives and bequeaths £5 each to her grandchildren John & Robert Ellis, sons of the said Ellis Isaac and Margaret his wife.

Gives and bequeaths to **her grandson Valentine Owen** her cupboard located in Cravnant House and marked with the letters O:P:.

Gives and bequeaths £3 to her grandson William Owen of Moil y Glo.

Gives and bequeaths £5 to her granddaughter Jane Ellis.

Gives, leaves, devises and bequeaths to **her granddaughter Ann Ellis** all her household stuff in the house where she now resides commonly called Ty Newydd *als.* y Gegin, together with a staple chest or meal chest, a chees press and a bedhead now located in the chamber in Craynant House.

All the rest and residue of her goods and chattels she gives, devises & bequeaths to her son-in-law Robert Jones whom she nominates and appoints sole executor of her last will and testament.

In a codicil she gives and bequeaths a further £11 to her said granddaughter Ann Ellis, a sum due to her from M^r. Poole of Cae Nêst.

And whereas she gave and bequeathed £10 to her grandson Griffith Williams, she now directs her Executor Robert Jones to not pay this legacy to the said Griffith Williams.

On 16 Oct 1746 an inventory of the goods and chattels of Ann Owen deceased was taken by Owen Rhydderch and Humphrey Owen and valued to £32.
