Gives to **Humphry Payne the son of his brother Humphry Payne** his best suit of clothes of linen and woollen, as well as half a crown.

Gives to Humphrey Payne his brother half a crown.

Appoints **Mary Payne his now wife** sole executrix of his last will and testament, to whom he gives all the rest of his goods and chattels.

An inventory of the goods and chattels of George Payne of the parish of Paul, husbandman, on 30 Nov 1709 and valued to £16 8*s*. 4*d*.

George Payn wrote his will eight days after he married Mary Reed in Paul on 20 Apr 1697. It would appear that George was a widower, as Elizabeth wife of Georg Payn was buried in Paul on 14 Jan 1696/7.

George Payn was buried in Paul on 4 Oct 1709. His wife Mary wrote her will in March 1724/5 in which she named George's nephew Humphrey as a beneficiary. Mary was buried in Paul on 24 Feb 1732/3.
