Abstract of the Will of James Thomas of the Parish of Mawgan in Meneage in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 25 Apr 1759, proved 25 Sep 1759.

Gives to **his wife** an annuity of £5 out of his estate called Boswisack for the term of her natural life.

Gives £35 to his daughter Elizabeth.

Gives £40 to his daughter Ursula.

Gives £40 to his daughter Rachel.

Gives £40 to his son James Thomas, along with his implements of husbandry.

Pays an annuity of 20 shillings to **his granddaughter Ursula Thomas** out of his Boswisack estate for the term of her natural life.

Gives 20 shillings to the rest of his grandchildren.

Appoints his sons Thomas Thomas and James Thomas co-executors of his last will and testament, giving them the rest of his personal estate and effects.
