## Abstract of the Will of John Bennett of the Parish of Rodborow in the County of Gloucester, written 2 Sep 1704, proved 5 Dec 1704.

Gives, devises and bequeaths his mills house and outhouses called Lightpill with its lands, tenements, meadows, pastures and arable land in Rodborow and Kings Stanley in co. Gloucester to **his wife Christian** during the term of her natural life. After her decease he gives and devises the same to **his daughter Joane Bennett** and to her heirs. And if Joane has no heirs he gives the same to **John the son of John Bennett** in the parish of Stroud in co. Gloucester.

Gives & bequeaths £500 to **his daughter Joane Bennett**, to be paid to her when she reaches the age of twenty-one years.

Gives £10 each to Giles and John the sons of his brother Richard Bennett.

Gives £10 to Elizabeth the wife of Gyles Horrell of Rodborow.

Gives one guinea to **Peter Clissold** to buy him a ring.

Gives £5 each to **the three daughters of his brother-in-law John Clissold**, namely to **Anne**, **Hester** and **Mary**.

Gives £5 to Gyles Bennett the son of James Bennett of Stroud.

Gives £5 to Elizabeth the wife of Samuel Harding or to her children of the parish of Kings Stanley.

Gives £5 each to Richard Higgins and Gyles Higgins of the parish of Arr.

Gives one guinea to William son of his brother Gyles Bennett to buy him a ring.

Gives 50 shillings each to Hester and Elizabeth Gardner.

Gives £5 to the poor of the parish of Rodborow.

Gives a guinea to his brother Gyles Bennett to buy him a ring.

Gives a guinea to the minister who performs his funeral sermon.

Gives £50 to **John the son of John Bennett**, to be paid to him on completion of his apprenticeship.

All the rest of his personal estate, debts and legacies, he gives and bequeaths to **his wife Christian** whom he makes sole executrix of his last will and testament.

Appoints his kinsmen **William Bennett** and **Peter Clissold** as overseers of his last will.
