Abstract of the Will of Mary Paine of the Parish of Paul in the County of Cornwall, Widow, written 9 Mar 1724/5, proved 13 Feb 1733/4.

Gives 20 shillings to **her kinsman Alexander Richards** and his two sons.

Gives 10 shillings to **her kinswoman Jane the wife of Thomas Lucas**.

Gives 10 shillings to **her kinswoman Charity the wife of Robert Cotton**.

Gives 10 shillings to **Arminell the wife of Thomas Chappell** of the parish of St. Agnes.

Gives 10 shillings to **her kinswoman Ann the wife of John James** of the parish of St. Agnes.

Gives 10 shillings to **her kinswoman Ursulah James**.

Gives two shillings sixpence to Thomas Leha of Newlyn, sen^r.

Gives two shillings sixpence to **her kinsman Walter Thomas**.

Gives two shillings sixpence, a brass crock and her great chest to **Humphrey Paine** of the borough of Helston.

Gives to **her kinswoman Elizabeth James** of Newlyn all her lands and tenements situated in Newlyn, along with all the rest of her goods and chattels, appointing the said Elizabeth James sole executrix of her last will and testament.
