

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/W/1789 W

Abstract of the Will of Thomas Wheare of the Parish of Gwinear in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 21 Sep 1709, proved 26 Apr 1710.

Gives to **his son Thomas** the tenement called Reowla.

Gives an annuity of £8 to **his sister Catherine**.

Gives to **his wife Catherine** his bed and its furniture, two pans and one crock.

Gives £10 to **his daughter Catherine**.

Gives £60 to **his daughter Mary**.

Gives £60 to **his daughter Ann**.

Gives 5 shillings to each of his grandchildren.

Gives £10 to **his grandson Tobyas Ingram**.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor [of the parish of Gwinear].

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his sons Richard and John**, appointing them co-executors of his last will and testament.

An inventory of the goods, lands & chattels of Thomas Wheare, yeoman, of Gwinear, late deceased, was taken 18 Oct 1709 by Francis Stone and John Inggrum and valued to £267 10s. 4d.

Thomas Wheare, Sen^r was buried in Gwinear on 29 Sep 1709.
