Abstract of the Will of Reuben Mills of Lawson's Creek near Mudgee, Farmer, written 14 Jul 1919, probate granted 2 Dec 1921.

Appoints his three sons George Henry Mills, Walter Charles Mills and Harold Reuben Mills, co-executors and trustees of his will.

Gives £100 along with all the household furniture and personal effects to **his wife**Henrietta Mills.

Gives to **his son George Henry Mills** a parcel of land containing 212 acres, 1 rood, 36 perches in Cudgegong, George paying to his brother Walter Charles Mills £100, and £40 per annum to his mother Henrietta Mills during her widowhood.

Gives to his son Harold Reuben Mills a block of land containing 15 acres and 14 perches in Burnberra, Harold paying to his brother Walter Charles Mills £300, and £45 per annum to his mother Henrietta Mills during her widowhood.

Gives to **his son Stanley Hunter Mills** land containing about 45 acres lying between the Cudgegong River and the Mudgee-to-Rylestone Road, Stanley paying to his brother Walter Charles Mills £300, and to his mother Henrietta Mills an annuity of £45 during her widowhood.

Gives £300 to **his son Walter Charles Mills**, Walter paying to his mother Henrietta Mills an annuity of £10 during her widowhood.

Gives £100 to his son Alfred James Mills, which amount is in addition to the £900 he has already received, Alfred paying to his mother Henrietta Mills an annuity of £10 during her widowhood.

Gives £200 to each of his four daughters Elsie Victoria Woolley, Emily Louisa Whitford, Florence Mary Pitt and Doris Amy Mills.

All the rest of his estate and effects he gives up to £400 to his four daughters, share and share alike, and the remainder thereafter to his sons.
