Abstract of the Will of John Borlas of Little Marlow in the County of Bucks, Esquire, written 25 Mar 1593, proved 14 May 1593.

Gives 20 marks to the poor. whereof 40 shillings to the poor people of Burnham, 46 shillings 8 pence to the poor of Little Marlowe, £5 to the poor of Great Marlowe and £4 to the poor of Wycombe.

Gives to **Anne his wife** £100, her clothing & jewelery, his teams of horses, his geldings, kine, sheep and cattle in Little Marlowe and Streaton Awdly in co. Oxford, all his carts, wheels, ploughs, harrows & gears in Little Marlowe, his coach, all the corn and hay in Little Marlowe and Stratton Awdly, and all his household stuff in Little Marlowe, for the term of her natural life. After her decease he wills the same to **his son William Borlas**.

Gives £40 to Blanche Borlas, daughter of his brother Edward Borlas deceased.

All his manors, lands, tenements and hereditaments he gives to **his son William Borlas** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.

Makes Mr. William Daye, Provost of Eaton, and Mr. Thomas Farmer of Great Marlowe, overseers of his last will and testament, giving them one each of his best geldings for their pains.
