

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/B/5239 W.

*Abstract of the Will of Joanna Brown of the Parish of St. Kew in the County of Cornwall, Widow, written 6 May 1811, proved 27 Jul 1811.*

Gives £5 to **her sister Margery Brown the wife of William Brown**, and 2 guineas each to **her children Prudence Scott, Margaret Moyle, Jane & William Brown**.

Gives 2 guineas to **her nephew Samuel Philp** of Pendogett.

Gives 2 guineas each to **her nephews James, Thomas, Samuel, Francis, William and Joseph Philp**, sons of her late brother Samuel Philp.

Gives 5 guineas to **her son-in-law Martin West**.

Gives an annuity of £5 each to **her grandchildren Joanna Skinner, Thomas Brown Skinner, William Skinner and Jane Skinner**, daughters and sons of her **daughter Jane Skinner**, to be paid out of her leasehold tenement called Button's Lannow in St. Kew. Gives to each of them £100, to be paid to them when each turns twenty-one.

Gives to **her grandchild Joanna Skinner** one-sixtieth share of Pichard Sean, commonly called Union Sean at Port Gavern Haven in the parish of Endellion.

Gives £100 each to **her grandchildren Joanna Brown West, Cathrine West, Nancy West and Martin West**, daughters and son of her daughter **Catherine West**, to be paid to them when they each turn twenty-one.

Gives to **James Philp** of St. Mabyn her leasehold estate called Button's Lannow, for the sole use of **her daughter Catherine West**.

Give £5 to her servant Elizabeth Hocking.

All the rest of her lands and tenements, goods and chattels, she gives to the said James Philp, in trust, for the benefit of **her two daughters Jane Skinner and Catherine West**.

Appoints **her two daughters Jane Skinner and Catherine West** co-executrices of her last will and testament.

Joanna was first married to Thomas Warne on 10 Aug 1758 in St. Kew. He was buried in St. Kew on 6 Sep 1762. Joanna married as her second husband Thomas Brown on 12 Apr 1766 in St. Kew.

Joanna Brown of St. Kew was buried in St. Endellion on 17 Jun 1811.
