

Abstract of the Will of William Browne of the Parish of St. Kew in the County of Cornwall, Merchant, written 2 May 1738, proved 28 Nov 1738.

Gives to **his son William Browne** and his heirs his fields or closes of land called Lane End, the Middle Field and Curhill, being part of a tenement called Toude's? tenement in the parish of St. Kew, and the reversion and inheritance of a tenement in the village of Pendoggett in St. Kew. Also gives to his son William his tenements called Penquite and Little Treveran in St. Kew, paying to **his son John Browne** £50.

Gives to **his son William** that part of the house that he now lives and the household goods, as well as his barn, stable, oxenhouse and wainhouse in Pendoggett, and all his implements of husbandry.

Whereas **his son William** has owed him £75 with interest since 25 Mar 1734, he directs him to pay out of that amount £40 to **his son Thomas Browne**.

Forgives his son Thomas's debt.

Gives 20 shillings to **his grandson John Browne**.

Gives to **his sister Garturide** her maintenance for life.

Gives 5 shillings each to **his sisters Mary and Elizabeth**.

Gives to his son John his right in all other parts of tenements in St. Kew.

Gives 5 shillings to **his son Abraham**.

All the rest of his goods and chattels, rights and credits, he gives to **his son John**, whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
