Abstract of the Will of Charles Cock of the Parish of Gwithian in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 22 Feb 1730/1, proved 6 Jul 1731.

Gives £50 to **his son Benjamin Cock**, half his right in Penventidnis, half of Sanders tenement and half of a little tenement in Connerton, all in Gwithian, a mare called Jenny, and 10 sheep.

Gives £50 to **his son Roger Cock**, the other half of Penventidnis, half of Sanders tenement, half of the other tenement in Churchtown, and a mare called Nimble.

Gives 100 guineas in gold to **his daughter Ann Cock**, and 30 shillings per year until she turns twenty-one.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his two sons Charles Cock and John Cock**, whom he appoints co-executors of his last will and testament.
