

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/1967/9.

Abstract of the Will of Bennet Johns of Wendron Church Town in the County of Cornwall, Farmer, written 21 Mar 1842, proved 30 Aug 1842.

Wills that his body be buried in Wendron Churchyard.

Gives to **his wife Ann** all his household goods, china, linen and effects, which will pass to his surviving children after his wife's decease. He also gives to his wife the dwelling house, along with all his horses, cattle, carts, implements of husbandry, and stock, desiring that she continue to farm the estates so long as she sees fit.

Gives to **his brother Francis Johns** and **cousin Bennet Johns** his share of several leasehold tenements, lands and mills, in trust, for them to pay the rents and profits thereof to his wife, and after her death, he wills the same to their surviving children, share and share alike.

Appoints his wife sole executrix of his last will and testament.
