Abstract of the Will of John Murley of the Parish of Gwinear in the County of Cornwall, Husbandman, written 8 Apr 1764, proved 30 May 1766.

Gives to **his wife Thomasine Murley** an annuity or yearly rent charge of £12, to be paid out of his estates of Trungle and Herland, both in the parish of Gwinear.

Gives to **his son William** and his heirs his freehold and leasehold rights in Herland aforesaid, subject to the payment of £4 per annum to his wife as part of her annuity, £50 to **his son Arthur** and £50 to **his daughter Mary**.

Gives to **his son John** his estate in Trungle, subject to the payment of £8 per annum to his wife as part of her annuity.

Gives £200 to his son Arthur, to be paid to him once he turns 21.

Gives £100 to his daughter Mary, to be paid to her once she turns 21.

Gives 1 guinea to **his daughter Philippa Edwards the wife of Edward Edwards** of the borough of Helston, gentleman.

All the rest of his goods, chattels and personal estate he gives to his wife in trust for the use of **his sons William and John Murley** whom he appoints co-executors of his last will and testament.
