

Prerogative Court of Canterbury and related Probate Jurisdictions: Will Registers, PROB 11/858/52.

Abstract of the Will of Thomas Philp of the Parish of St. Kew in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 29 Jan 1749/50, proved 9 Jul 1760.

Gives to **his wife Jane Philp** his tenement of fee land in Pendoggat where he now lives, paying an annuity of £4 to **his son William Philp** and an annuity of 40 shillings to **his daughter Margery Philp** until she turns twenty-one. After the death of his wife his fee land will descend to **his son William Philp** and his heirs.

Gives £40 to **his son Francis Philp** and his right in late Hocking's Tenement in Lanow.

Gives £40 to **his son Samuel Philp** and all his right in Lanow which came to the testator on the death of **his sister Chessen Philp**, it being a quarter part of Buttons and Tinnes Tenements and a quarter part of Lanow Mill and Meadows.

Gives £50 to **his daughter Joanna Philp**.

Gives £50 to **his daughter Margery Philp**, to be paid to her when she turns twenty-one or marries.

Appoints **his wife Jane Philp and his son Francis Philp** co-executors of his last will and testament
