Gives to his wife £6 13s. 4d.

Gives £5 each to his six children who are married.

Gives 40 shillings to his granddaughter.

Gives to his daughter Alls [Alice] one cow which is now in her keeping.

Gives 29 shillings to his son William and gives 40 shillings to William's child.

Gives 6 shillings 8 pence to the poor man's box of Gwinear.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor man's box of Gwithian.

Gives 12 pence each to his four godchildren.

Gives his servants 12 pence each.

Gives his best cloak to his father-in-law\*.

Gives to his brother Alexander Stevens his coat and his best suit.

Gives to his son Francis Stevens his great chest.

Gives to his daughter Rebecca his little chest.

Gives his horse to his wife and to his son Francis Stevens.

Gives his lease in a close called Panterau to his father-in-law\* for the use of the testator's children.

All the rest of his goods & chattels he gives to his father-in-law\* whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.
