The Will of William Vivian of Crenver in the Parish of Crowan and County of Cornwall, Miner, written 9 Jul 1814, proved 20 Mar 1815.

I William Vivian of Crenver in the parish of Crowan and County of Cornwall being of sound judgment and in my right mind Declare this to be my last Will and Testament
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First commending my Soul to God Do hereby give and bequeath unto **Phillippa my wife**, after my decease All and singular my Goods, Chattles and Effects of every description after discharging my Debts and the Expenses of my Burial. To have and to Hold the same to her own use during her life and full power to give and dispose of the same or the residue thereof by Will or otherwise to our children and Grand children as she shall at any time think proper. Witness my hand this ninth day of July One thousand eight hundred and fourteen.
