

Kresen Kernow (formerly Cornwall Record Office), Reference: AP/W/653 W, Inv.

Abstract of the Will of Humphry Willyams of the Parish of Gwithian in the County of Cornwall, written 31 Dec 1639, proved 4 Mar 1639/40.

Directs that his body be buried in the parish churchyard of Gwithian.

Gives 2 shillings for forgotten tithes.

Gives 12 pence to the poor of St. Udy.

Gives to **Jone the daughter of Stephen Pawlye** a two-year-old heifer. Gives one ewe lamb each to the rest of his children.

Gives one heifer each aged one year to the two daughters of **John Whita** as well as 30 shillings each that John Whita owes the testator.

Gives to **Humphry the son of his cousin Willyams** a round table board and a little chest.

Gives a ewe each to **W^m and Anne the children of his brother Bawden**.

Gives a half bushel of barley to **Humphry Whita**.

Gives 10 shillings to **Richard Pensew the younger** and to **his daughter Anne** one ewe and a lamb.

Gives one ewe lamb to **Morish? Pensew**.

Gives to **Mary the wife of W^m Cocke** his maser cup.

Gives one ewe to **Katherine Cocke**.

Gives one ewe to **Cheston Pensew**.

Gives 10 shillings to **John Williams** of St. Udy **his eldest brother's son**.

Gives to **his cousin W^m Willyams** his table board and form as well as 40 shillings.

Gives to **Anthony Cocke, Constance and Grace** a ewe lamb each and 2 shillings apiece.

Gives to **Richard the son of his brother Bawden** one ewe and lamb and 6 shillings 8 pence, as well as his coat.

Gives to **Sapience the widow of his brother Bawden** 5 shillings.

Gives one ewe lamb or 2 shillings to **Blanche the daughter of his brother Bawden**.

Gives one ewe lamb or 2 shillings to **Charles Hockin**.

Gives 5 shillings to the poor of the parish.

All the rest of his goods he gives to **his son-in-law James Whita** whom he appoints sole executor of his last will and testament.

Nominates W^m Willyams and Wm Cocke overseers of his last will and testament.
