Abstract of the Will of Richard Tuffnayle, Citizen and Brewer of London, written 9 Aug 1640, proved 1 Sep 1640.

Gives to his five children Richard Tuffnayle, John Tuffnayle, Mary Tuffnayle, Elizabeth Tuffnayle and Hannah Tuffnayle £700 each.

Gives to his two sons-in-law* Thomas Moore and William Moore £40 each. [* children of his wife's first marriage]

Gives to his wife his land at Deptford for the term of her life and thereafter to his son Richard. And if he should die before he reaches the age of 21 years, then the same land shall go to his son John.

Gives to his son John his house at Highgate, unless he ends up with the land in Deptford, in which case he gives said house to his daughter Mary after the death of his wife.

Gives to his daughter Mary his lands at Islington, unless the house at Highgate falls to her, in which case his lands at Islington are to be divided between his two other daughters.

Gives £20 to his cousin* Robert Boucher. [* brother-in-law]

Gives £10 to his sister Anne Boucher to share among her children.

Gives £5 to his sister Hellen Bentley.

Gives £30 to his servant William Becadin?.

Gives 40 shillings to his servant Richard Kendall.

Gives £10 to his friend Mr Francis Tailor, parson of Clapton.

Gives 40 shillings to his friend Mr Francis Bridgers of Clapton.

Gives 40 shillings to Jane Housewife, widow.

Gives £100 to his wife to be distributed among the poor in Great

Gives £10 to his sister Godwyn to be divided among her children.

Gives £8 to the poor of St. Olave.

Gives £3 to the poor of Clapham in Surrey.

Gives £3 to Mr. John Pemberton of Clapham.

Gives 40 shillings to his servant Katherine.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his wife Elizabeth Tuffnayle** whom he makes sole executrix of his last will and testament.
