Abstract of the Will of Thomas Broome of Bisseter in the County of Oxon, Glover, written 21 Nov 1685, proved 8 Aug 1705.

Gives to <u>his son Joseph Broom</u> his house where he now lives, along with the outhouses and barns.

Gives to <u>his son John Broom</u> his house and outhouses currently occupied by his tenant Francis Hakins.

Gives the stone wall separating the two houses above to <u>his son Joseph Broom</u> for him to keep in good repair.

Gives to <u>his daughter Mary Ginger</u> his house currently in the possession of George Jeffes, along with two little outhouses adjoining the barn and that part of the yard joining to the outhouses straight from the little gate to the corner of the barn wall.

Gives to <u>his daughter Ann Broome</u> his house currently in the possession of Edward Bissell, along with its outhouses. He also gives her one joined bedstead, one flockbed, one bolster, one coverlid, one pair of blankets, two pair of sheets, his great brass pot, his biggest brass kettle, and his best pewter platters.

All the rest and residue of his goods and chattels he gives to <u>his son Joseph Broom</u> whom he makes sole executor of his last will and testament.
