Abstract of the Will of John Cramp of the Parish of St. Mary of the Castle in the County of Sussex, Yeoman, written 29 Jan 1683/4, proved 14 May 1685.

Gives 10 shillings to the poor people of the parish of Crowhurst.

Gives £50 to **his now wife Mary**, along with his copyhold tenement and lands called Blackwells in the Crowhurst, for the term of her natural life.

Gives to his eldest son William £20 which was left to him in the will of William's deceased grandfather William Wymble, as well as an additional £20, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

Gives 20 shillings to **his youngest son John Cramp**, to be paid to him when he turns twenty-one.

All the rest of his personal estate he gives to his two daughters Mercy and Anne.

Appoints his wife Mary and his eldest son William co-executors of his last will and testament.

Nominates **his brother-in-law Nicholas Weston** and **his kinsman John Fuller** of Hollington overseers of his will, giving them 10 shillings each for their pains.
