Abstract of the Will of William Sanders of the Parish of Camborne in the County of Cornwall, Yeoman, written 27 Mar 1754, proved 14 Oct 1757.

Gives £1 5s. to his sister Chatrine Sanders.

Gives to **his daughter Jane** his estate in Merriss in the parish of Illogan, following the death of his wife.

Gives to **his daughter Mary** that part of the vern that belongs to Mr. Percifell following the death of his wife. He also gives her 5*s*. if she marries William Pearce the son of John Pearce.

If his wife remarries he gives her an annuity of 20s. only.

Gives to his son two thirds of his effects, the other third going to his two daughters.

All the rest of his goods and chattels he gives to **his wife Mary** and to **his son William**, making them co-executors of his last will and testament.

William Sandars and Maray his wife were married in Illogan on 26 Dec 1715. Her family name is not recorded.

There is no record of William's burial in either the Camborne or Illogan parish registers.

Mary Sanders, widow, was buried in Camborne on 24 Sep 1758.

Daughter Mary Saunders of Camborne married the named William Pearce on 18 Nov 1758 in Gwithian, witnessed by (her brother) William.
